Nature of planning

Theory of Choices - Under planning, the best option is selected out of all the available options, so that the desired results can be achieved at the lowest cost.

Theory of Competitive Fronting - This principle emphasizes that while planning, planning should be done keeping in mind the planning techniques, programmes, future plans etc. of the competing organizations.

Principle of Continuity - Planning is a dynamic and continuous process. Therefore, its continuity must be kept in mind while planning.
